History

The property was part of a large tract of land owned by the Florida East Coast Railway Company and was sold to The Overseas Road Toll Bridge District in 1936. The Marathon Yacht Club was formed on April 24, 1951, with 24 members present. Chet Tingler was elected our first Commodore. Construction was started on our clubhouse in 1954. In 1976 the BELL, our monthly newsletter, was born. When a bottle of spirits ran dry, a bell at the bar was rung, and the lucky imbiber got a free drink, hence the name. It is published monthly and the Bell is still at the bar today. In 1983 Marathon Yacht Club joined the Florida Council of Yacht Clubs (FCYC).



Dining

During the summer the Marathon Yacht Club offers lunch two days a week, and dinner five days a week. In season, we offer many events such as dinnerdances with live music on our hardwood dance floor, grill nights by the pool, holiday parties, game and karaoke nights, and more. Marina facilities

The marina was completely rebuilt in 2011, and in 2024 the walkways were completely replaced with Trex docking. Each slip has 30 and 50 amp power, water, cable TV and internet.
